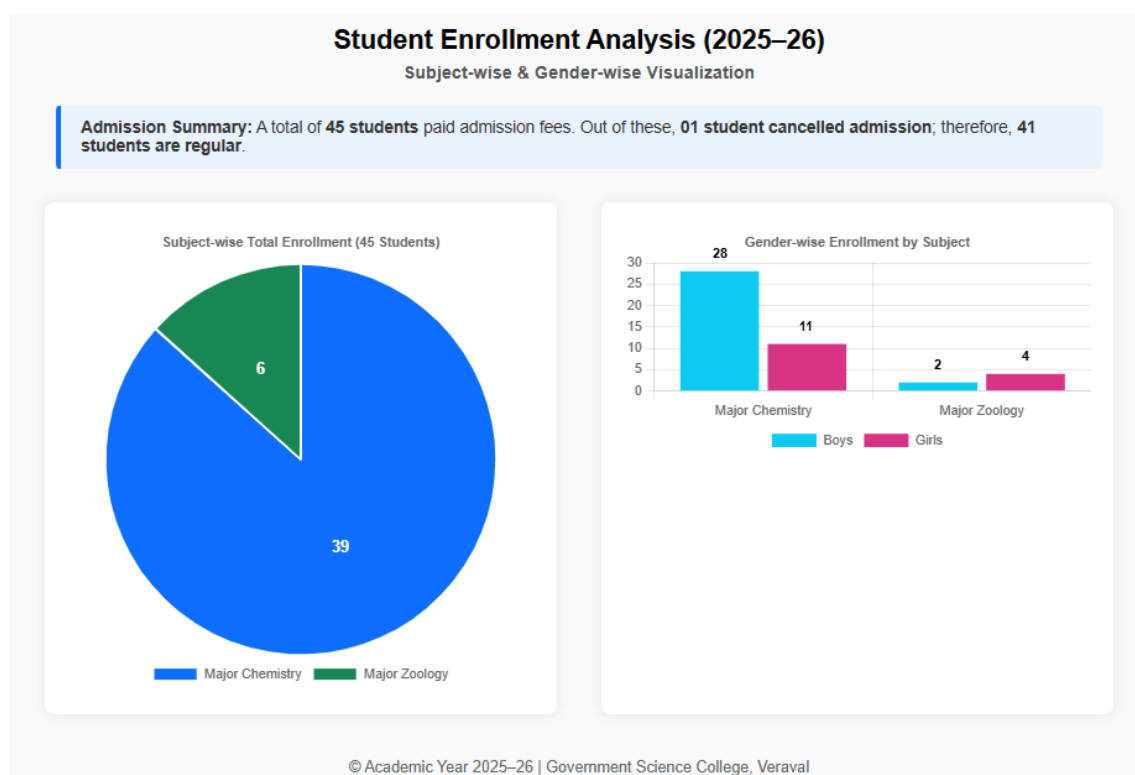

### 2.1 Enrolment

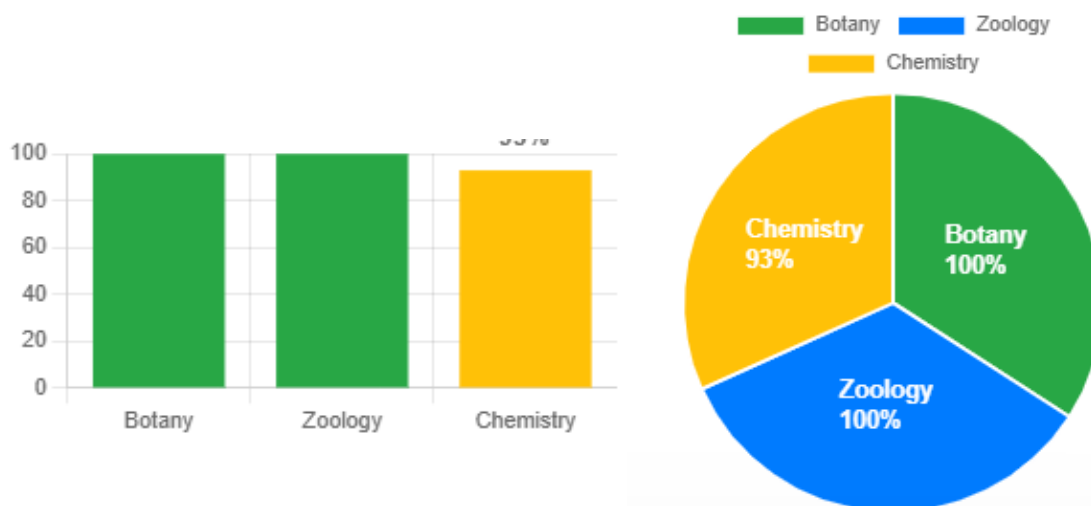
In alignment with the National Education Policy’s emphasis on multidisciplinary education, Government Science College, Veraval have introduced major subject offerings in Chemistry, Zoology, Botany and Physics during the academic year 2025–26. These subject choices were made available to cater diverse academic interests and career aspirations of students. The college witnessed healthy enrolment across all disciplines, reflecting students’ growing interest in the pure sciences and the institution’s consistent academic reputation. The enrolment trends depicted in the accompanying graph demonstrate encouraging participation across the newly offered major subjects. Overall, the data highlights the institution’s ongoing efforts to provide diverse, accessible and quality higher education in the Gir Somnath district.



## 2.2 Result

Government Science College, Veraval has consistently maintained an excellent academic record over the years. In the academic year 2025–26, the college continued its tradition of outstanding performance in the university examinations. Students from various major subjects, including Chemistry and Zoology, performed exceptionally well, with many securing first class with distinction. Notably, students of the college have been securing higher ranks at the university level in the final examinations for consecutive years, which reflects the academic rigor and dedication of both, students and faculty. Regular internal evaluations, remedial coaching and mentorship have played a significant role in supporting student success.

## 2.3 Use of ICT in Teaching and Learning

At Government Science College, Veraval, we use many ICT tools to make teaching and learning better and more interesting. Teachers use PowerPoint presentations with videos and pictures to explain topics clearly. We use Google Classroom to give study materials, assignments and stay in touch with students. YouTube videos are also used to help students understand topics in a fun and easy way. For quick tests and collecting opinions, we use Google Forms. Our college website also provides old exam papers for students. By using all these tools, we make learning modern, simple and useful to help students get ready for the digital world.

## 2.4 Educational Tour and Industrial Visit

During the academic year **2025–26**, Government Science College, Veraval organized multiple **educational visits, industrial tours, innovation exposure programs, and nature education camps** with the aim of strengthening experiential learning, environmental awareness, industrial exposure, and holistic student development. These activities were conducted under the guidance of the respected Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and coordinated by dedicated faculty members.

1. A **One-Day Nature Education Camp** was organized at **Sakkarbaug Zoological Park, Junagadh on 29 July 2025**, coordinated by **Mr. Jaydeep B. Zala**, in which **40 male students** participated. The camp provided practical exposure to wildlife conservation, biodiversity, and the ecological role of zoological parks through expert-guided sessions and firsthand observation of animals and birds.
2. An **Industrial Visit to Ambuja Cement Factory, Kodinar** was conducted on **8 August 2025** in collaboration with the **Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), Rajkot-2 Regional Office**, under the coordination of **Ms. Priya Mange (Standard Club Mentor)**. **29 students(29 Boys & 10 Girls)** participated in this visit, which enhanced their understanding of cement manufacturing processes, quality control, and industrial standardization practices.
3. A one-day educational **visit to the District Community Science Centre (DCSC), Gir Somnath**, was organized on **1 September 2025** for F.Y. B.Sc. students of Government Science College, Veraval under the Science Club. The visit was coordinated by **Dr. D. K. Pandya and Ms. Kajal Barad** under the guidance of Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag**. Students explored the science lab, innovation and IP lab, watched documentaries on the Milky Way, and participated in a quiz competition. A total of 35 students (22 male and 13 female) participated in the informative and engaging visit.
4. A **Three-Day Nature Camp – Prakruti Shikshan Shibir** was organized at **Sasan Gir from 18 to 20 November 2025**, coordinated by **Mr. J. B. Zala and Ms. K. A. Barad**, with participation of **41 students(27 girls and 14 boys)**. The camp included nature education sessions, jungle trails, biodiversity studies, Devaliya Safari visit, cultural activities, and awareness programs on water conservation, pollution, and ecosystem balance.
5. Under the **Innovation Club**, an **Educational Visit to the Vibrant Summit (Gir Somnath District)** was organized on **15 December 2025**, coordinated by **Dr. Priya L. Mange, Shri Jaydeep B. Zala and Dr. Dhananjay Pandya**, with participation of **25 students(14 girls & 11 boys)**. The visit exposed students to innovation, entrepreneurship, startup ecosystems, industrial exhibitions, and government initiatives, encouraging creative thinking and entrepreneurial awareness.

6. A **Two-Day Nature Camp at Junagadh** was conducted on **30–31 December 2025** by the **Department of Zoology**, coordinated under the guidance of **Dr. S. B. Chhag**, with field coordination by **Dr. C. M. Gosai**. **Eighteen girl students** participated and gained hands-on exposure to zoology, bird watching, trekking, wildlife observation, and conservation practices.
7. A **2 Nights and 3 Days Nature Education Camp** was organized at **Batheshwar Campsite, Jamvala from 30 December 2025 to 1 January 2026**, coordinated by **Dr. D. K. Pandya**, with participation of **38 male students**. Activities included long-distance trekking, biodiversity observation, documentary screenings, and survival-based learning, promoting teamwork, leadership, and environmental responsibility.
8. An **Educational Visit to Vibrant Summit 2026** was organized at **Marwadi University, Rajkot on 13 January 2026**, coordinated by **Dr. D. K. Pandya**, with **10 students** participating. The visit provided exposure to emerging technologies, innovation models, and real-world applications of science and technology.
9. On **16 February 2026**, organized an educational **visit to Saurashtra University on World Innovation Day** under the guidance of Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag and coordination of Dr. Priya Mange. Funded by the Knowledge Consortium of Gujarat (KCG) Innovation Cell, 31 students (Males) visited the Incubation Center and science departments to gain exposure to research, innovation, and startup ecosystems. The visit enhanced students' understanding of intellectual property rights, entrepreneurship, and interdisciplinary research opportunities.
10. A **visit to the Community Science Centre, Somnath** was organized on **26 February 2026** for Second Year B.Sc. students under the Science Club of Government Science College, Veraval. A total of 25 students participated under the guidance of the coordinator Dr. Dhananjay Pandya and Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag. During the visit, students learned about robotics, explored the Innovation Lab, and watched a short educational film on innovation and technology. A quiz competition was also conducted in which Makwana Ronit, Aparnathi Sneha, and Bamaniya Bhavesh secured the first three ranks. The program concluded with prize distribution and refreshments, and the visit proved to be informative and beneficial for the students.

Overall, these activities significantly contributed to students' **academic enrichment, practical understanding, environmental consciousness, innovation awareness, and professional readiness**. The successful execution of all programs reflects the institution's commitment to **quality education, experiential learning, and continuous improvement**, in alignment with **IQAC and NAAC objectives**.

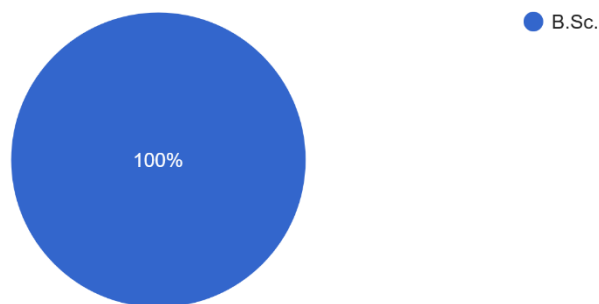

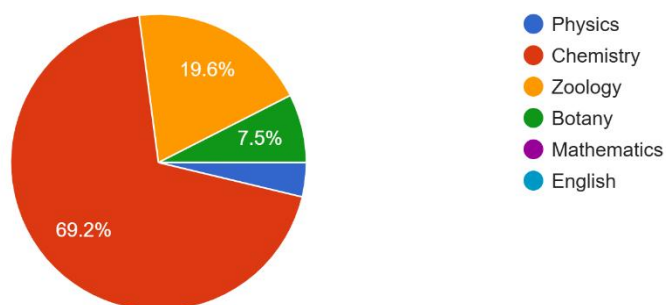
## 2.5 Feedback System and Action Taken

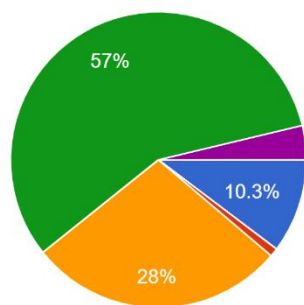


Major Subject

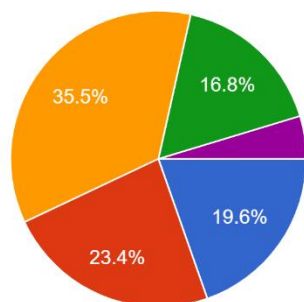

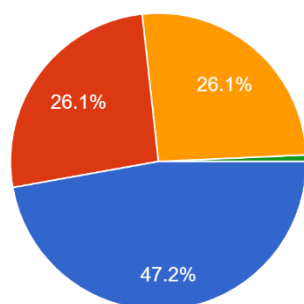

### Design of the course curriculum (અભ્યાસક્રમની રચના)

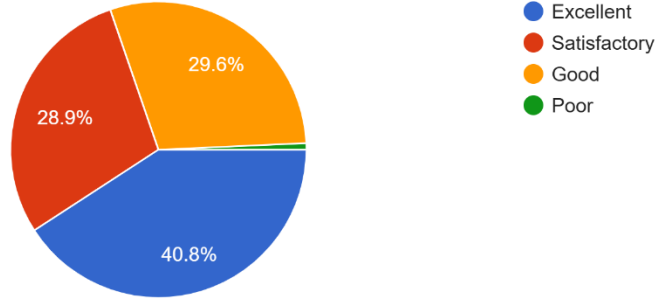

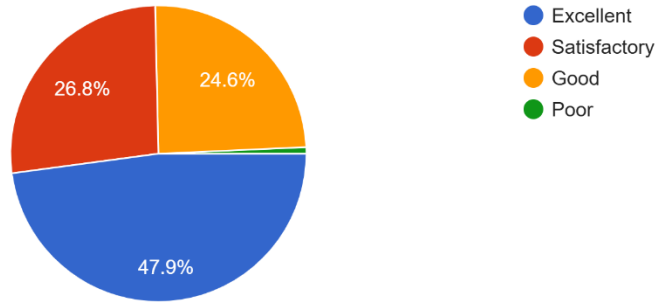

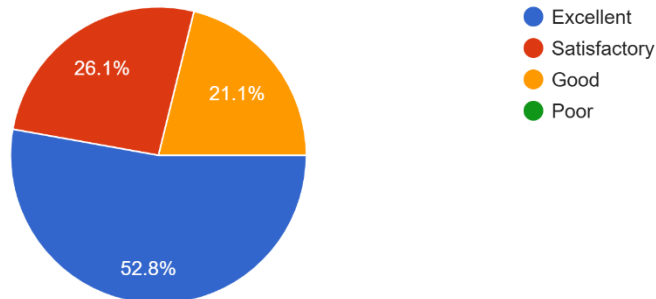

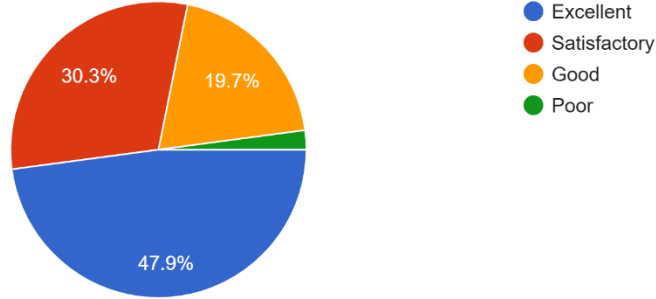

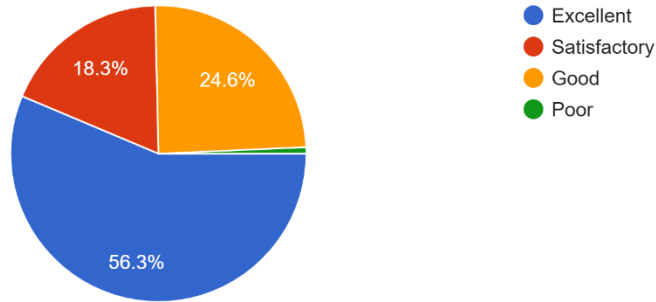

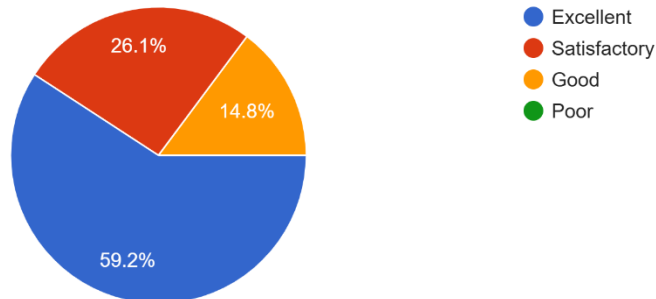

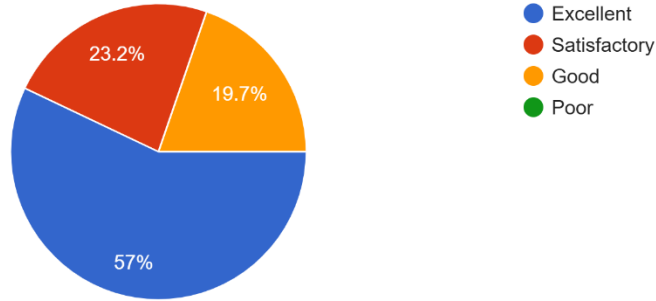

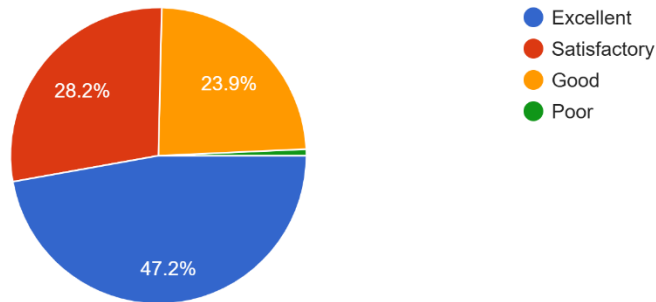

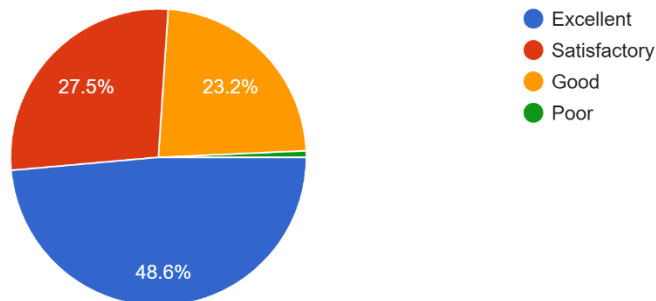

## 2.8 State Quality Assurance Cell

During the academic year **2025–26**, the **Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC)** of Government Science College, Veraval actively organized and coordinated a series of academic, awareness-oriented, and co-curricular activities aimed at promoting **quality enhancement, scientific temperament, creativity, sustainability awareness, and holistic student development**. All activities were conducted under the able guidance of the Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag** with the active involvement of faculty coordinators and resource persons.

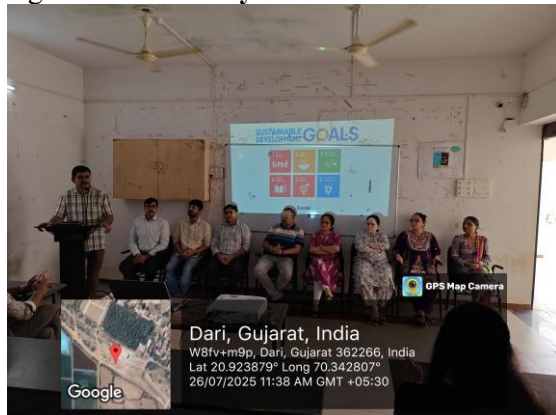
1. A **One-Day Workshop on “Sustainable Development Goals & Climate Change”** was organized on **26 July 2025** under the banner of SQAC. The workshop was coordinated by **Dr. C. M. Gosai (Head, Zoology Department)**, with **Mr. J. B. Zala (Head, Botany Department)** serving as the Organising Secretary. The expert speaker, **Dr. Rajesh Raviya**, Professor of Botany, Bhakt Kavi Narsinh Mehta University, Junagadh, delivered an insightful lecture on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, climate change challenges, biodiversity conservation, renewable energy, and the role of youth in sustainable development. The programme witnessed enthusiastic participation from **69 students (Male 44, Female 25)**, and successfully enhanced environmental awareness and responsible citizenship among learners.
2. Further strengthening quality assurance initiatives, a State Level Seminar on **“Revised NAAC Framework: From Policy to Practice”** was jointly organized by the SQAC of Government Science College, Veraval and the SQAC of Knowledge Consortium of

Gujarat (KCG) on 23 August 2025 at Hotel Heritage, Veraval. The seminar was coordinated by Dr. Sachin Sitapara, with support from SQAC Coordinator Dr. C. M. Gosai. The event recorded 72 registrations, with 63 participants, including 9 Principals and faculty members from 29 institutions across multiple districts of Gujarat. The programme was graced by **Chief Guest Pratapsinh Chauhan**, Vice-Chancellor of Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University, and **Guest of Honour Sukanta Kumar Senapati**, Vice-Chancellor of Shree Somnath Sanskrit University. Expert sessions were delivered by **Dr. Ramesh Kothari** and **Dr. Firoz Shaikh**, focusing on accreditation reforms, digital transformation, and strategic interpretation of the revised NAAC framework. The seminar served as an important capacity-building platform for higher education institutions.

3. As a flagship academic and outreach initiative, the college organized **State Level Science Carnival–2026** on **8 January 2026**, under the umbrella of SQAC, providing a vibrant platform for students from schools, colleges, and universities to showcase scientific knowledge, creativity, and innovation. Multiple academic and creative competitions were conducted as part of the carnival.
  1. A **Scientific Rangoli Competition** was coordinated by **Dr. D. K. Pandya**, witnessing participation from both school and college categories. The event encouraged students to creatively represent scientific concepts through art, successfully blending science with creativity.
  2. A **Poem Writing Competition on Science Themes**, coordinated by **Ms. U. V. Parmar and Dr. D. K. Pandya**, promoted scientific imagination and literary expression among school, undergraduate, and postgraduate students.
  3. A **Quiz Competition**, coordinated by **Mr. V. D. Bakotra, Dr. Priya L. Mange, and Ms. Kajal A. Barad**, engaged **51 students** at school and college levels, strengthening scientific knowledge, analytical thinking, teamwork, and competitive spirit.
  4. A **Poster Making Competition** on Scientific Themes, coordinated by **Dr. C. M. Gosai and Dr. Sachin Sitapara**, encouraged creativity, visual communication, and scientific awareness among school, undergraduate, and postgraduate students.
  5. **Oral Presentation** and **Poster Presentation** competitions were organized under the coordination of **Dr. P. L. Mange, Dr. C. M. Gosai, Dr. Mamta Chauhan, and Dr. Sachin Sitapara**, attracting wide participation from students across various disciplines and academic levels. These events provided a valuable platform for research-oriented thinking, scientific communication, and academic interaction.

## 4.2 Placement Cell

During the academic year **2025–26**, Government Science College, Veraval actively organized placement-oriented initiatives to enhance students' employability and strengthen industry–institution interaction. These activities were conducted under the guidance of the respected Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and coordinated by the college Placement Cell in collaboration with external agencies.

1. An **Institute-Level Placement Drive** was organized on **4th September 2025** at Government Science College, Veraval, in collaboration with the **Placement Cell, Gujarat**. The drive was coordinated by **Dr. M. F. Dhaduk, Placement Officer**, with active support from **Dr. S. M. Sitapara and Mr. J. B. Zala**. Two reputed organizations, **LIC of India** and **HDFC Life Insurance Ltd.**, participated in the recruitment process. The placement drive was open to final-year students and recent graduates, and approximately **35 students** participated enthusiastically. The event included an inaugural session, company presentations explaining job roles and career prospects, followed by **one-to-one interviews** conducted by the recruiters. The drive served as an effective platform for connecting students with employment opportunities in the insurance sector.
2. Further strengthening placement efforts, a **Placement Fair** was organized on **21st November 2025** at the college campus in collaboration with the **District Employment Exchange Office, Gir Somnath**. The fair was coordinated by **Dr. M. F. Dhaduk, Placement Coordinator**, along with **Employment Official Shri Kanabhai Ram**. Two companies participated in the fair: **Nextedge Ecommerce Pvt. Ltd., Mundra–Kutch**, offering positions for Machine Operators, and **Raichura Energies, Talala**, recruiting for Sales Executive, Telecaller, and Mechanic positions. A total of **32 candidates**, including **4 students from Government Science College, Veraval**, participated in the fair. Students interacted directly with recruiters, gaining insights into job requirements, employability skills, and career growth opportunities.
3. Organized a **Placement Fair on 20th February 2026** in collaboration with the District Employment Exchange Office to provide employment opportunities to students and local job seekers. A total of 84 candidates participated, including 15 students (12 male and 3 female) from the college. The programme was conducted under the guidance of Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag and coordinated by Dr. M. F. Dhaduk, with support from Dr. S. M. Sitapara and Shri J. B. Zala. Six companies—Perfect Auto Service, Shakti Super Market, Reliance Retail (Veraval), Marshal Trading Co. (Mahindra), Trimurti Automobile, and Bonanjo Saloon and Academy—participated and conducted interviews. The fair successfully connected students with potential employers and strengthened the college's placement initiatives.
4. Organized **Placement Camp 2026 on 26 February 2026 at 10:00 AM** in collaboration with the Placement Cell, Government of Gujarat, and partner institutes including Mahila Arts & Commerce College Veraval, Smt. C. P. Choksi Arts & Shree P. L. Choksi Commerce College Veraval, and Government Arts & Commerce College Talala Gir. A total of 12 companies participated and 85 candidates attended the camp. The event provided an effective platform for students and job seekers to interact with recruiters and explore diverse employment opportunities, strengthening career prospects and employability.

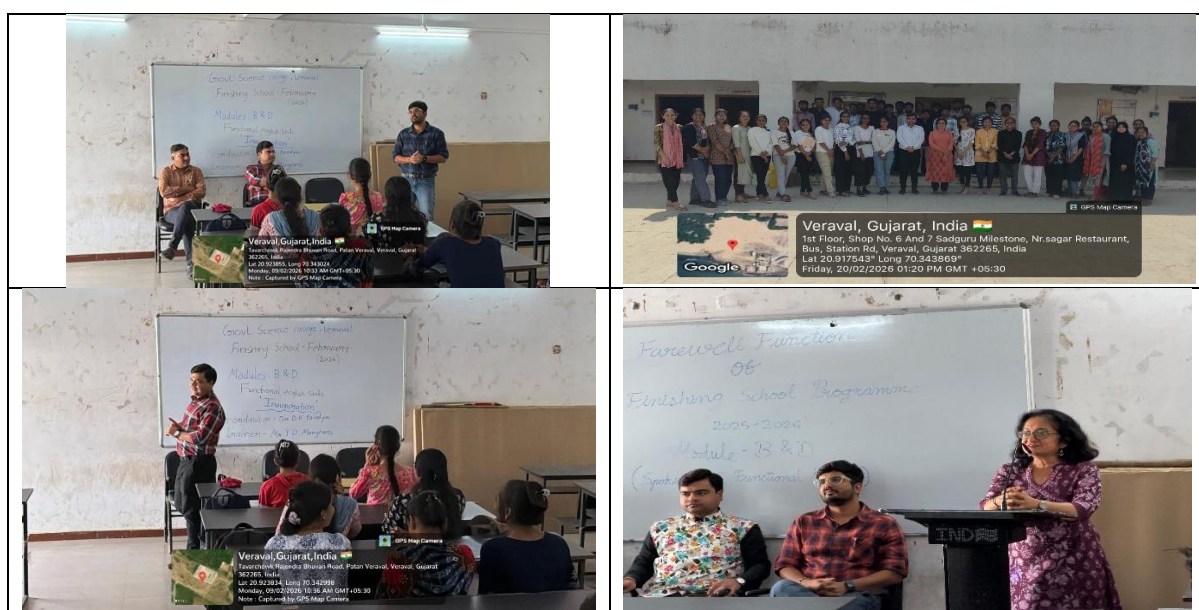

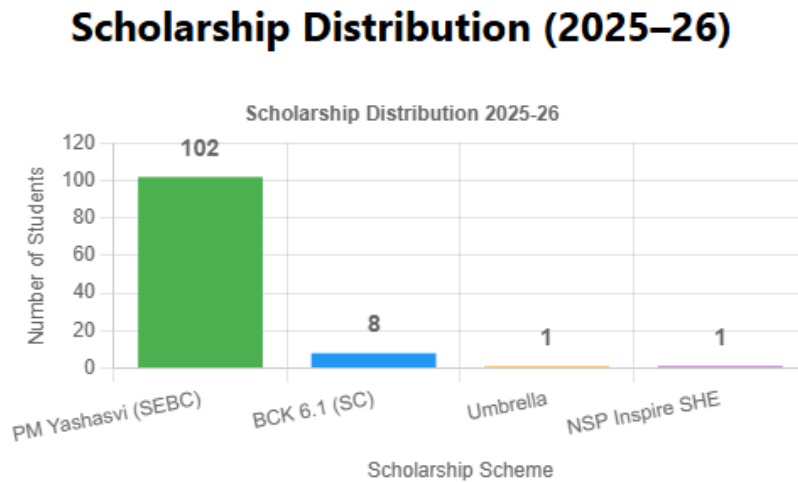
### 4.3 Finishing School Programmes

The **Finishing School Training Programme 2025–26** was organized at Government Science College, Veraval under the initiative of the Knowledge Consortium of Gujarat (KCG) to enhance students’ employability through soft skills and spoken English training. ## 5.2 National Service Scheme Activities

During the academic year **2025–26**, the **National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit** of Government Science College, Veraval conducted a wide range of awareness, outreach, environmental, health, constitutional, and nation-building activities, reflecting the institution’s strong commitment to social responsibility, community engagement, and holistic student development. All activities were carried out under the able guidance of **Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and were systematically coordinated by **Dr. Sachin M. Sitapara, NSS Programme Officer**, with active participation from NSS volunteers, NCC cadets, faculty members, and community partners.

1. On 5th June 2025, World Environment Day was celebrated through an online quiz competition due to summer vacation, focusing on plastic pollution awareness. A total of 26 students participated in the quiz. Simultaneously, NCC cadets conducted a coastal clean-up drive, promoting environmental responsibility through practical engagement.
2. On 21st June 2025, the 11th International Yoga Day was celebrated in the college campus with 27 participants, including 15 students and 12 staff members. The session promoted physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. NCC cadets also represented the college at the Indian Coast Guard Headquarters celebration.
3. On 25th June 2025, an Essay Competition on Samvidhan Hatya Diwas was organized with 17 students participating, including 4 male and 13 female students. The activity enhanced constitutional awareness and democratic values among students.
4. On 9th July 2025, a Vaccination Awareness Program was conducted with active participation of 57 NSS volunteers who carried out door-to-door awareness campaigns regarding DPT, TD10, and TD16 vaccines, strengthening community health outreach.
5. On 1st August 2025, a Plant Distribution Drive under “Ek Ped Maa ke Naam 2.0” was organized with 16 NSS volunteers, including 10 male and 6 female students. Saplings were distributed to promote environmental sustainability and emotional bonding with nature.
6. On 10th August 2025, ten students participated in the World Lion Day Awareness Rally under the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, promoting wildlife conservation and ecological awareness.
7. On 11th August 2025, a Clean-Up Drive was conducted with participation of 33 students, including 18 male and 15 female students, fostering cleanliness and patriotic spirit under the Har Ghar Tiranga initiative.
8. On 12th August 2025, the college participated in the District-Level Tiranga Yatra with 23 students, including 19 male and 4 female students, strengthening national unity and respect for the tricolour.
9. On 15th August 2025, Independence Day was celebrated with participation of 10 students in the Flag Hoisting Ceremony under the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, reinforcing patriotic values.
10. On 30th August 2025, an Awareness Program on Drug, Tobacco and Substance De-addiction was organized by the NSS Unit of Government Science College, Veraval in collaboration with the District Tobacco Control Cell, Health Department, Gir Somnath. The programme was conducted under the guidance of Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and coordinated by **Dr. Sachin M. Sitapara (NSS Programme Officer)** and **Mr. J. B. Zala**. A total of **27 students participated, including 19 male and 8 female students**. The session included an awareness lecture by **Ms. Dipti Vyas, Social Worker, NTCP Health Branch, Gir Somnath**, and was organized under the supervision of the Chief

District Health Officer and Epidemic Medical Officer. Following the evaluation as per Tobacco-Free Educational Institution guidelines, the college was officially declared a **Tobacco-Free Educational Institution**, marking a significant achievement in promoting a healthy and addiction-free campus.

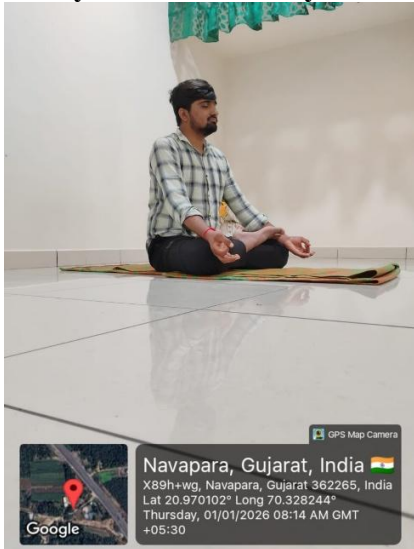

## 5.3 National Cadet Corps Activities

## 5.4 Cyber Awareness Programmes

During the academic year 2025–26, Government Science College, Veraval organized a comprehensive series of Cyber Awareness, Cyber Security, Digital Well-being, and CAWACH (Cyber Awareness & Well-being Action for Citizens of Gujarat) programmes, reflecting the institution's proactive approach towards creating a **digitally safe, responsible, and mentally resilient student community**. All activities were conducted under the able guidance of **Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and were systematically coordinated by **Dr. Mamta H. Chauhan**, CAWACH Coordinator, with support from the **Cyber Cell, Psychology Cell of GSCV, Veraval City Police Station, and Cyber Police Station, Veraval**.

1. To initiate cyber literacy among students, a **Cyber Security Awareness Programme** was organized on **9th July 2025**, focusing on cyber frauds, phishing, identity theft, cyberbullying, and misuse of personal data. The programme included screening of short awareness videos based on real cybercrime incidents, followed by an open discussion session. A total of **34 students (21 boys and 13 girls)** actively participated, shared their online experiences, and clarified doubts related to privacy protection and safe internet usage. The programme was successfully coordinated by **Dr. Mamta Chauhan** under the guidance of **Principal Dr. Smita Chhag**, creating strong foundational awareness about cyber safety.
2. Further strengthening cyber security awareness, a **Cyber Awareness Seminar** was organized on **6th August 2025** under the **Cyber Security & CAWACH initiative**, with financial support from the CAWACH grant. The keynote address was delivered by **Mr. S. V. Rajput, Police Inspector, Cyber Police Station, Veraval**, who elaborated on cybercrime trends, social media safety, online fraud prevention, and cyber laws. A total of **59 students (41 boys and 18 girls)** attended the seminar, which was highly interactive and informative. The programme enhanced students' alertness towards digital threats and responsible online behaviour.
3. Recognizing the interconnection between mental health and digital well-being, an **Awareness Seminar on Suicide Prevention and Cyber Well-being** was organized on **10th September 2025**, on the occasion of **World Suicide Prevention Day**, jointly by the **Psychology Cell and Cyber Cell (CAWACH)**. The seminar was delivered by **Dr. Arjan M. Chocha**, Assistant Professor of Psychology, who addressed psychological, emotional, and social factors contributing to suicidal tendencies among youth. He emphasized resilience, positive coping strategies, and the harmful impact of excessive social media use, advocating mindful and balanced digital habits. The programme was attended by **46 students (25 boys and 21 girls)**. A **Poster Making Competition** on the themes of *Suicide Prevention* and *Cyber Wellness* further encouraged creative expression and awareness. The programme concluded with the felicitation of the keynote speaker by the Principal.
4. To reinforce cyber law awareness and community policing, a **Cyber Awareness Seminar** was conducted on **1st October 2025** in collaboration with the **Veraval City Police Station**. The keynote session was delivered by **Police Inspector Mr. H. R. Goswami**, supported by **ASI Ms. Krishna Zala, Head Constable Ms. Pragna Chavda, Police Constables Mr. Ashok Mori and Mr. Jayesh Dodiya, and IT Expert Mr. Sandip Dodiya**. Real-life cybercrime cases, preventive strategies, and legal provisions were explained in detail. A total of **43 students (28 boys and 15 girls)** participated, making the session highly engaging and practical.
5. To promote analytical thinking and ethical digital behaviour, a **Cyber Awareness Essay Competition** was organized on **11th November 2025** under the **CAWACH Kendra**. A total of **12 students (5 boys and 7 girls)** participated and presented insightful essays on online privacy, cybercrime prevention, and responsible internet usage. **Zala Priya** secured the First Rank, while **Nandaniya Smeet** secured the Second Rank. The competition successfully enhanced students' understanding of cyber ethics and digital responsibility.
6. As part of **Social Media Awareness Month**, a **Cyber Awareness & Social Media Responsibility Seminar** was organized on **10th December 2025**. The session was conducted by **ASI Ms. Krishna Zala and Head Constable Ms. Pragna Chavda** from Veraval City Police Station, who highlighted cyber fraud patterns, online financial scams, identity theft, and misuse of social media platforms. Preventive measures such as strong passwords, two-factor authentication, and cautious information sharing were

emphasized. A total of **44 students (29 boys and 15 girls)** actively participated, making the programme impactful and relevant to contemporary digital challenges.

7. To develop leadership and volunteerism in cyber safety, **Cyber Volunteer Programme Training Sessions** were conducted on **15th January 2026** under the **CAWACH initiative**. The sessions focused on cyber volunteer registration, fundamentals of cyber security, emerging technologies such as **AI, ML, and IoT**, and career opportunities in cyber security. A total of **11 first-year B.Sc. students** successfully registered as Cyber Volunteers. The programme was coordinated by **Dr. Mamta H. Chauhan**, with technical support from **IT Expert Mr. Ghanshyam Vaja**, and was effectively implemented under the guidance of **Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag**.
8. On 11th February 2026, Government Science College, Veraval organized a **Cyber Awareness Seminar** under the CAWACH Programme in collaboration with the Cyber Crime Department, Gir Somnath, under the guidance of Principal **Dr. Smita B. Chhag** and coordinated by **Dr. Mamta H. Chauhan**. A total of **53 students participated, including 30 male and 23 female students**, along with faculty members. The seminar was led by **Ms. Tabbasum K. Ranika, Head Constable (Keynote Speaker)**, with support from Ms. Dhara Mori (Technical Operator) and Mr. Nitin Jethva (Police Constable), who explained various types of cybercrimes, online safety measures, responsible use of social media, and legal aspects of cyber security. The interactive session enabled students to clarify their doubts and gain practical knowledge about safe digital practices. The programme proved highly informative and successful in promoting cyber awareness, and it concluded with refreshments provided under the CAWACH Grant and geo-tagged photographs taken for official documentation.

Overall, the Cyber Awareness and CAWACH activities during the academic year significantly contributed to:

- Promotion of cyber literacy, digital safety, and responsible online behaviour
- Enhancement of awareness regarding cyber laws, online fraud prevention, and data security
- Strengthening of mental health awareness and digital well-being among students
- Development of ethical values, analytical thinking, and responsible citizenship

## 5.5 Standard Club Activities

During the visit, students were exposed to the complete cement manufacturing process, including **raw material handling, clinker production, cement grinding, packaging units, and quality testing laboratories**. They observed real-time industrial operations and learned how BIS standards are implemented to ensure product quality, safety, and sustainability. The visit helped students bridge the gap between theoretical classroom knowledge and real-world industrial practices. The programme concluded with a lunch hosted by the Ambuja Cement Factory management. All arrangements for the visit were efficiently managed by **Ms. Priya Mange**, Standard Club Mentor, under the guidance of **Principal Dr. Smita B. Chhag**, making the visit highly informative and well-organized.

2. In addition to industrial exposure, the Standard Club encouraged student participation in national-level quality awareness programmes. To commemorate **World Standards Day 2025**, students of the college participated in a **National Level Online Quiz Competition on Science and Standards**, organized by **BIS** on **14th October 2025**. A total of **8 students (3 boys and 5 girls)** from the **Department of Physics** actively participated. The students prepared using the **Standards Watch Video Series (Episodes 18, 19, and 20)** as recommended by BIS.

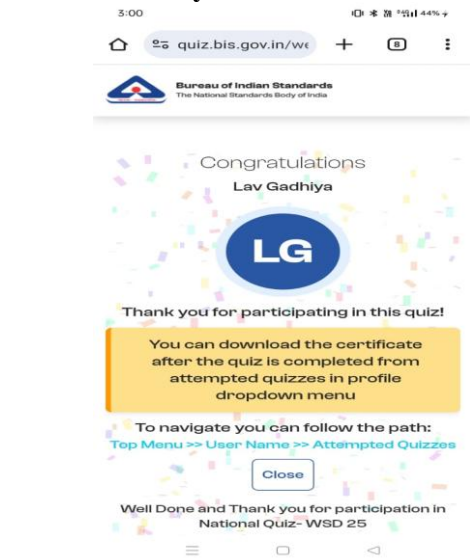

## 5.6 No Addiction Campaign

During the academic year 2025–26, Government Science College, Veraval organized an **Awareness Programme on Drug, Tobacco and Substance De-addiction** on **30th August 2025** under the joint initiative of the **NSS Unit and the No Addiction Cell**, in collaboration with the **District Tobacco Control Cell (NTCP), Health Department, Gir Somnath**. 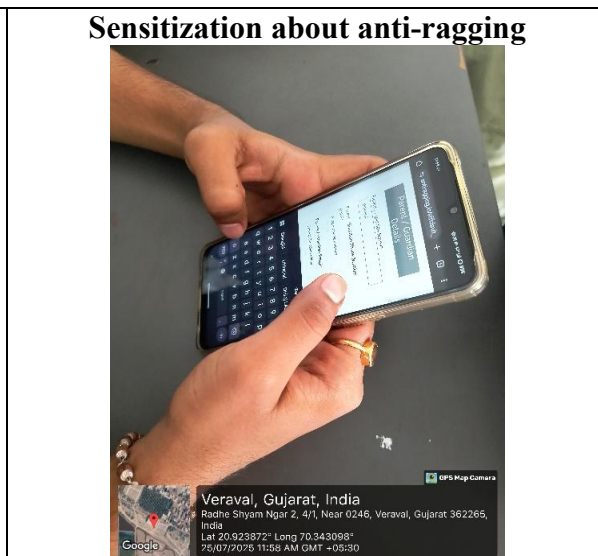
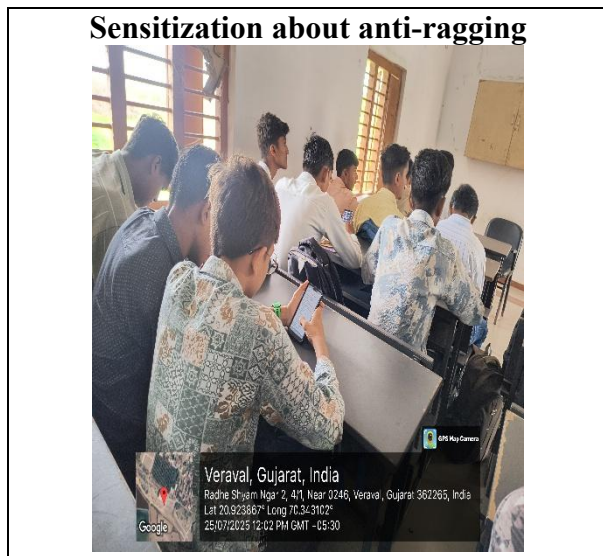

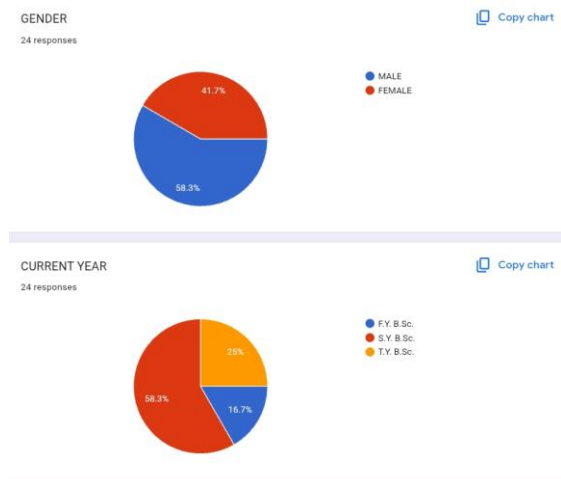

### **Key Areas of Learning**

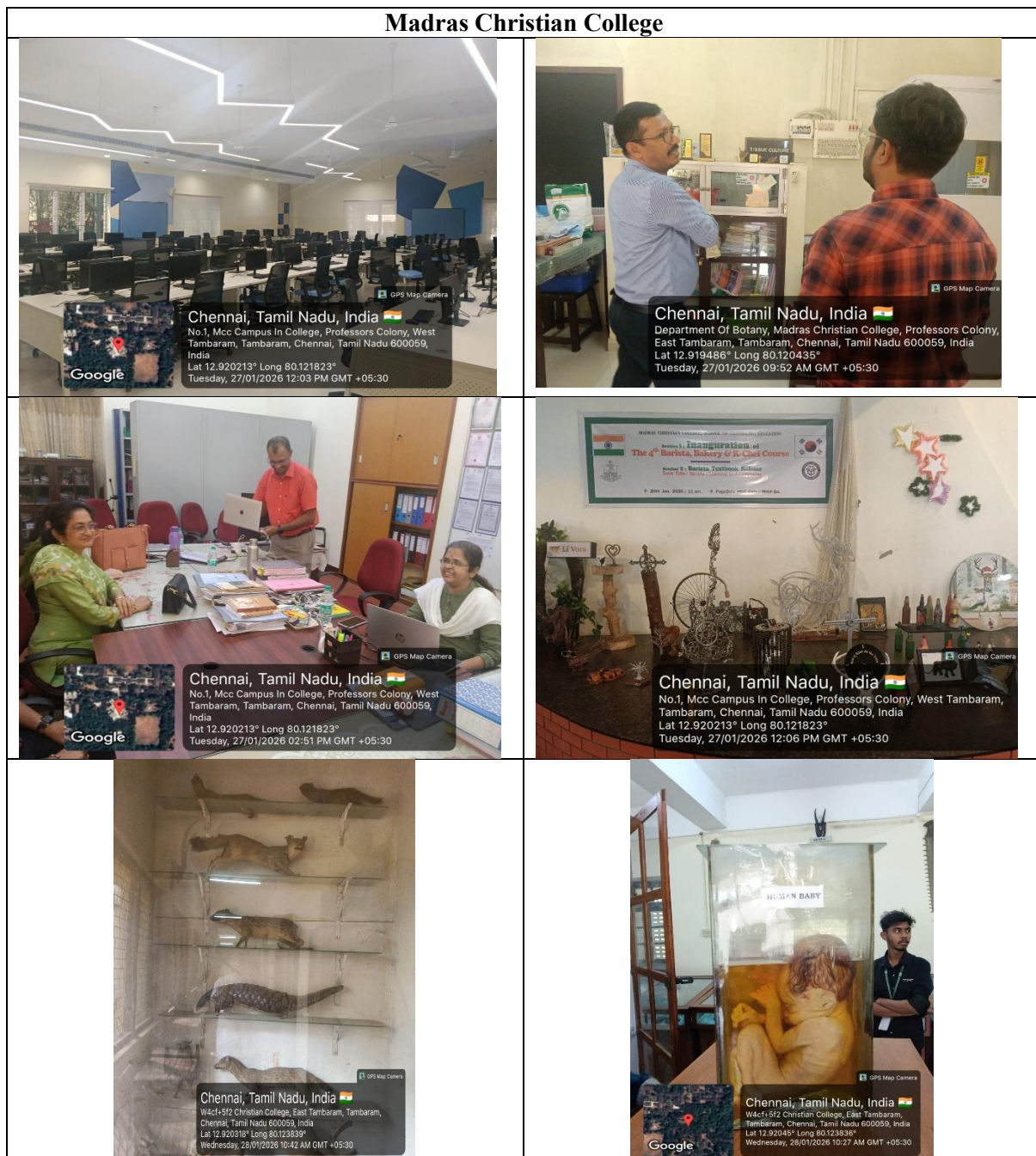
The visit provided significant insights into several aspects of academic and institutional development, including:

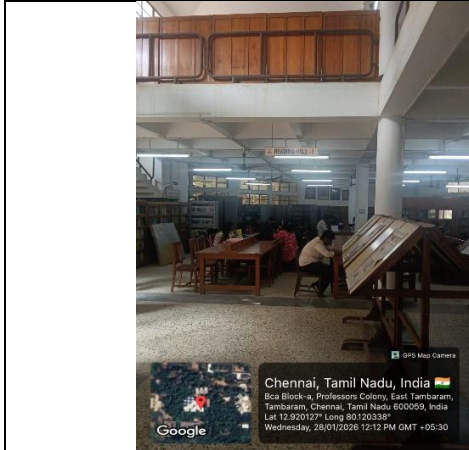
- **NAAC-aligned quality enhancement strategies and documentation practices**
